I have to acknowledge the receipt of your telegram of today in reference to the working pressure of the boiler you are about to construct for the S.S. "LIZZIE & ANNIE" of Boston, and in returning herewith the plan submitted for approval with your letter of the 20th. inst., I am directed to acquaint you that provided a $\frac{3}{8}$ " compensating ring be fitted round the manhole in shell below the dome; two additional stay tubes be fitted, as shown amended on the plan; the steel used be tested as required by the Rules; the plan in other respects be adhered to, and the boiler be built under the usual conditions of survey and testing and to the entire satisfaction of the Society's Engineer Surveyors; the same will be approved by the Committee for the intended working pressure of 60 lbs per square inch.

After noting the alterations on the plan, kindly forward it again for the Surveyor's guidance during construction.

I enclose a special survey order form, which kindly sign and return at your convenience.
