Sir,

In reply to your enquiries in the classing letter of the 28th regarding the Motor Vessel "LIZZIE & ANNIE" Hull report 381, I beg to state that cargo battens are not fitted in holds, the vessel has no sidelights, the machinery is aft. Vessel has four bulkheads. There is a sluice valve on the hold between Nos. 1 & 2 holds worked from the deck and a valve on the forward engine room bulkhead worked from the room platform and is at all times accessible. There are 1 pumps in the vessel, diameter of barrels 4", 1 to fore 1 at after end of No 1 hold and 1 at after end of No. 2 hold pipes 2½" outside diameter. For particulars of Suctions engine room please see machinery report.
