Dear Sirs,

I duly received your letter of the 22nd instant, respecting the classification of the motor vessel "LIZZIE & ANNIE", and with regard thereto I have to request that you will let me know whether the vessel is fitted with full sail power so that she can be navigated without the use of the machinery.

With regard to your enquiry relative to the examination of the screw shaft, I have to say that no classification could be assigned to the machinery without the screw shaft being drawn in for examination.

I have further to add that in the event of the Owners deciding to carry out a survey for re-classification it is considered that in view of the age of the vessel the survey held should be of a stringent character, and the Surveyor should be joined by Mr. Gibbs, the Principal Surveyor at your port.
