We duly received your letter of the 6th instant regarding the welded air receiver for this vessel, and have to inform you that arrangements are being made for a new riveted receiver to be built under survey and placed on board in about ten days time.

In the meantime, in order that the vessel may resume her sailings for which she is urgently required, it is the Owners wish to work with two solid drawn steel oxygen bottles, which have been tested to 1000 lbs. per sq. inch, and we trust that in the special circumstances this arrangement will be approved as a temporary measure.


