Stern Bush in good order. Fastenings of sea cocks good.  
A feed pump 3 $\frac{1}{8}$  dia. has been satisfactorily fitted to the side of the Circulating pump. This pump is worked from the after side of the pump levers, and is in addition to the two Worthington pumps originally fitted to supply the Main Boilers at sea.

A pipe has been fitted so that the Engine Room Belges may be pumped out with the Ballast donkey.

General Observations, Opinion, and Recommendation:— The Machinery of this vessel so far as seen, is now in good order and safe working condition, and eligible in my opinion to remain as classed.
