State also the dates and initials of any letters respecting this case.

AIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR

This vessel, inward bound, with a cargo of oil in Bulk, grounded in the Schuylkill river, remaining one tide.

An examination of decks, upper Works etc., gauging of tanks, failed to show any damage, leakage or straining.

It was therefore recommended, that the vessel proceed on her voyage, to be examined in drydock at the first convenient opportunity.
