OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR *Grounding,*

This vessel, coming up the Delaware in Ballast, grounded above Reddy Island, during a fog, on a soft muddy bottom, remaining about 5 hours, and getting off without assistance.

All the oil tanks, holds, Machinery spaces, upper works, decks etc, were carefully examined, and no evidence of straining or leakage could be found. It was recommended that she proceed on her voyage, and to be further examined in Drydock at the first convenient opportunity.
