which began on 1st inst, and they wish to delay the survey
until the vessels have made one or two voyages.

With reference to your letter of the 19th inst, respecting the steamers "BAKU STANDARD", "JAMES BRAND", "VEDRA", and "BROADMAYNE", we beg to acquaint you that all these vessels are at present in the Tyne.

In the case of the "BROADMAYNE" this vessel is to have some damage repairs carried out and the Boilers will be submitted to survey.

The "VEDRA" and "BAKU STANDARD" are to have the machinery surveys carried out, but the Owners Superintendent Mr. Eeles informs us that his instructions from the Owners are that only the docking will be done in connection with the Special surveys which became due in May last, and they wish to defer the completion until the vessels have made one or two voyages.
