Dear Sirs,

H. I have to acquaint you that the barque "PASSAT", No. 04314 in the Register Book, has recently been under the inspection of the Society's Surveyors at Marseilles with a view to reclassification in this Society's Register Book. The Surveyors report that the requirements of a Special Survey No. 3 have been carried out except that the outside plating requires to be cleaned and coated down to the light line and completely scaled for examination from the light line to keel and it is understood that these matters will be attended to on the vessel's arrival at Hamburg whither she is now bound.

I may further say that the shell plating requires to be drilled if considered necessary and it would also appear that the plating in way of the sidelights requires to be examined, and also that 30 fathoms of chain cable require to be supplied to make the total length equal to the requirements of Table 30 of the Rules.

I shall be glad if you will be guided accordingly and arrange for the case to receive the necessary attention in due course.

I may add that it is understood that this vessel has been returned to her late German Owners.
