I am in receipt of your letter of the 19th instant from which it is noted that the four masted barque "PASSAT" which is now the property of the French Government has been submitted to survey with a view to reclassification in the Society's Register Book.

With regard thereto I may say that the class of this vessel was expunged from the Register Book in December 1916 when she was the property of German Owners, and in order to render her eligible for reinstatement of class, it will be necessary for the full requirements of the Society's Rules as regards Special Survey No. 3 to be complied with and for the vessel to be placed in a thoroughly satisfactory condition to your entire satisfaction.

You will be good enough to let me know in due course how the case stands.
