The Owners Survey on the  
8/3/85 and following dates the Steel  
Screw Steamer "Annie", of Goole,  
443 tons, while on blocks in dry dock  
at the port of Goole, for the purpose  
of ascertaining the amount of the  
damage said to have been sustained  
through collision and lying submerged  
in the River Humber.

For further particulars see the  
Log Book and protest.

Upon examination found the  
Keel and bottom badly chafed, seven  
(7) plates on Starboard side in way  
of main gangway broken, two  
Stringer plates badly bent and  
damaged and four (4) frames and  
keelbeams broken in way of same broken  
and bent; the side rubbing about  
for about forty feet started and  
damaged, and one plate on Starboard

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bow badly buckled and damaged; one  
plate on port side at upper turn of  
bilge badly buckled and damaged,  
and shell frames and reverse frames  
in way of same bent and damaged;  
the caulking of main & forecastle  
decks strained and ruptured; the  
plating of under broken and  
damaged.

The vessel having been  
submerged for several tides, the  
work, fittings and furniture in  
cabin, officers berths, forecastle,  
galley and holds <sup>were</sup> more or less  
damaged or destroyed by mud &  
water.

Recommended that the broken  
buckled and bent plates be renewed  
and the damaged frames be  
efficiently repaired; the rubbing  
chock to be made good; the main  
and forecastle decks to be recaulked;  
the plating of under to be renewed;  
all close ceiling and lining to be  
removed and the wood and iron  
work cleaned and painted; the  
cementing of bottom to be repaired  
where required and the ceiling and  
lining refitted or renewed; the  
work, fittings and furniture in
