In reply to your request for details statement of the
"Glenwood" battle of Iron I beg leave to state that I
could perceive no molecular alterations on the plates & that
for their several years past - same time I would
not have you understand that there has been no more
corrosion but that it plays in such a slow manner that
it is difficult to define it. I observed a very little water
had some time since, run down inside from some sticking
which had rusted the plates - merely such rust or would
rub off with a hard broom. The top has preserved
the original form unimpaired shows no motion of the
workings - I am of opinion that some fault shape that
be required once again to enable them to be placed
but to the conclusion from seeing the plates in several
Iron with slight deflection prepared to be replaced
