If the Survey is not complete state what arrangements have been made for its completion and what remains to be done?

Exam'd cylinders pistons, shims, Pumps, condenser, crank, thrust, tunnel & propeller shafts, all sea cocks, pipes, h.p. suction, etc. & details and found in good condition.

H.P. cylinder shims out and new piston fitted, L.P. shims redrawn up and washed, the h.p. pump plunger removed.

Exam'd main boiler throughout and found satisfactory. Two patches filled in lower comb. throat tube plate, one on each side and one large patch filled on lower, com. throat back. Two lower man hole doors unglued.

Exam'd donkey boiler throughout and found in good order all safety valves adjusted as above.

General Observations, Opinion, and Recommendation:—The machinery of this vessel
