When the sales took place we requested Messrs. James Currie & Co. to advise us officially to whom they had been sold, but we were informed that they had already written direct to London on the 10th instant on the subject.

On receipt of your memo of yesterday's date in connection with the s.s. "STETTIN" we again approached Messrs. Currie & Co., and we now learn that their letters were addressed to Lloyd's Corporation and not to you.
