Dear Sir,

M. Reverting to your letter of the 10th instant respecting the scale model of the "CUTTY SARK" which you are building for the South Kensington Museum, I have pleasure in stating that when the marking of freeboard became compulsory in 1891 a freeboard was assigned by this Society, the freeboard being 4'-3", and this was marked as shown on the sketch enclosed herewith.

The class of the ship expired in 1899 and the above freeboard became invalid, but a temporary certificate was issued in 1919 by the Board of Trade to enable the ship to make a voyage to Lisbon.

The Official Number and the Signal Letters which are assigned to a ship never change, and in the event of a ship leaving the British Register for a Foreign Register and then returning to the British Register, the original numbers and letters are restored.
