Halifax April 2<sup>nd</sup> 1888

We, the undersigned, this day proceeded  
on board of the S.S. "Nederland"  
and found that the repairs recommended to be  
made to the said vessel, by the survey of the  
Tide Surveyors, have been completed. The  
repairs, although only of a temporary  
character, are sufficient to put the vessel in  
a fit condition to proceed with her  
cargo to her port of destination.

The moulding around the stern has  
been broken and damaged by the coffer-dam.

The portion of the cargo that was landed  
has been reloaded and is properly stowed. Every  
possible care was taken to protect it from injury  
at the time it was being landed, while lying  
on shore and during reshipment.

We do therefore Certify that the aforesaid  
S.S. "Nederland," of Antwerp, is now in a  
fit condition to proceed with her cargo  
to her port of destination.

second day of April A.D. 1888.
