respecting the Q.S.T.S. "AQUITANIA", I have to confirm my
telegram to you today as follows, viz:-

"AQUITANIA Board Trade do not concur with
"any decrease freeboard until fresh calculations
"made pending further action freeboards
"provisionally given may be marked as follows
"from centre line to top statutory deck line
" $\frac{1}{2}$ inch above two inch sheathing steel upper
"deck D 19 feet six fresh nine Winter nine
"inches".

Six of the plans forwarded with your letter of
the 1st instant are returned herewith, and the plan of
under water sidelights and profile showing the bulkheads
have been retained for attachment to the freeboard papers.
