I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 21st instant in regard to the freeboard of the new Motor Vessel "VICEROY OF INDIA", and, in reply, I have to acquaint you that, as desired, Mr. Potts has examined the plans of this vessel on the basis of an assumed depth corresponding to a summer moulded draft of 28'-7" and he finds that the scantlings and arrangements are equivalent to the Rule requirements.

I enclose herewith a copy of a letter which has to-day been received from the Builders in regard to the freeboard.

A form of verification of freeboard, as at present marked, is being forwarded to-day.
