ARISTON.—Copenhagen, Mar. 9.—Fire broke out on board Norwegian steamer Ariston (Ventspils for Ghent) early day after she had broken through ice off Stubbekobing, Falster. Police said that in addition to the crew of six people from Stubbekobing who had helped the ship through pack ice were on board. (Later) A rescue vessel has taken firemen and equipment to the Ariston and they were reported to be getting the fire under control. The crew remain on board but the men and boys from Stubbekobing have been brought ashore. The Ariston is carrying a cargo of potash.—British United Press.

Copenhagen, Mar. 9.—Norwegian steamer Ariston, icebound outside Stubbekobing since Jan. 20, caught fire in engine-room early morning; now under control by Stubbekobing fire brigade.

Copenhagen, Mar. 9.—The fire has now been put out on board steamer Ariston. The master confirmed that there were no injuries.—British United Press.

ARISTON.—Copenhagen, Mar. 10.—Norwegian steamer Ariston, which had been lying frozen-in in the ice off Stubbekobing for two months, had fire break out on board at 2 a.m. on Mar. 9, destroying the galley, engine-room and the whole of the afterpart of the vessel. The fire was extinguished during the course of the morning. The crew of five have left the vessel and are now at Stubbekobing, only the master remaining on board. It is reported that the vessel will be sequestered when she is towed to Stubbekobing in the next few days.—"B. sen." (See issue of Mar. 11.)

ARISTON.—New York, June 7.—Norwegian steamer Ariston has been sold to Danish shipbreakers. (See issue of Mar. 13.)

ARISTON.—Masnedsund, June 17.—Steamer Ariston arrived here on June 16 from Ventspils via Stubbekobing after fire damage with kali for re-discharging. (See issues of Mar. 13 and June 12.)
