The Tonnage Opening in the Shelter Deck has been trunked up and permanently closed with a Skylight. The overboard scuppers in the Tween Decks have been removed and their openings closed with rivetted plates. New Tween Deck scupper pipes fitted, same being led to bilges.

No openings cut in vessels side to effect position of the Loadline disc.

Displacement Scale New scale is in course of preparation and I understand it is being sent to the Owners Office when completeOld Freeboard CertificatesFrom the steamer I received Certificate dated, 1st. March 1919 (in Duplicate) and herewith forward same for cancellation.Port of Registry & Owners Name

There has been some hitch re alteration of change of Registry. In anticipation of the change of Name and port being approved, vessels new Name and Hamilton, Bermuda, were cut in and painted at the Stern. On return of vessels Register from Liverpool, her Name and Tonnage figures were altered, but her Owners: address and port of Registry were unaltered.
