The class is subject to bottom plating being faired at the Owners' convenience.

The 1st S.S.No.3, due 7,32, has been partly held.

The Vancouver Surveyor now reports the vessel placed in dry dock and the Special Survey completed.

The bottom has been cleaned and coated and repairs effected to hatches etc.

The indented bottom plating, as above, has not been dealt with at this time.

Special examination has been made of all electric welding throughout the vessel and found in good condition.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain as classed with record of survey 9,35 and notation of S.S.No.3-9,35, subject as above.
