Dear Sir,

Having been out of town for the last 4 days (Visits to Berlin, Brandenburg, Magdeburg & Wolgast), I am but now able to reply to your letter of the 16th instant respecting the 60-mm. water regulating valve for the s.s. "COMTE ROSSO".

I was requested urgently by letter of Messrs. Siemens-Schuckertwerke A.G., Berlin, to examine this valve in finished condition and test it in accordance with the order of Messrs. Witkowitzer Bergbau- & Eisenhütten-Gewerkschaft to 240 kg./sqcm. water pressure. This was carried out with satisfactory result in connection with the Registro Italiano and the British Corporation, (both Society's represented by the Germanischer Lloyd).

As it could not be ascertained here whether this valve was of primary importance a certificate stating the fact that the cast steel material of it has not been tested &c. was made out and forwarded to the Vienna Office, a copy of this with a letter was sent to the Trieste Surveyors, in which I expressed my doubt, whether this valve could be accepted in this case.

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I may add that the cast steel part of the valve was found to be free from any surface defects and perfectly tight and sound at the above water pressure.


