Loeffler Boiler and Escher Wyss Turbine Installation.

Mr. Wesendanger and Mr. Flatt, representing Messrs. Escher Wyss, called at this Office and presented a copy of a further letter confirming that a turbine casing, made of the Firm's special cast iron, had proved satisfactory over a period of 7 years, whilst working at a normal temperature of 360°C.

This letter was provided by Messrs. Regia Salina, Volterra, Italy. These gentlemen also left two graphs, resulting from their laboratory experiment, showing the properties of the material at high temperatures, and the liability of the material to growth, both of which qualities appear to be satisfactory.

It is now considered that no objection need be taken to the proposal to use this material for the feed pump turbine casing for this installation.

An enquiry was also made as to whether spare gear would be required for this installation and they were informed that as this machinery was auxiliary to the main machinery, no spare gear need be supplied.

IT IS SUBMITTED that the London Representative of Messrs. Escher Wyss be informed that the evidence they have produced regarding the use of their special ^{feralite} ~~feralite~~ cast iron for turbine casings has been examined and as it is regarded as satisfactory, no objection will be taken to the proposal to use the material for the feed pump turbine casing for this installation.

This gentleman might also be reminded of the further



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

