Dear Sir,

We are in receipt of your letter of the 25th ult., with reference to the "Loeffler" boiler installation, and note with pleasure that the tests results are considered generally satisfactory.

Regarding the impact tests, the Izod test results, given in the certificate were read direct from the Izod testing machine, in metre kilograms, thus the results given are in metre kilograms and not metre kilograms per sq cm.

The special reason why the results of the Izod tests are so much lower than those of the Messnager tests, is due to the different shape of the notches, viz: pointed for Izod and round for Messnager tests.

It is also found, that material of high tensile strength, especially when it is welded, gives much larger differences between the Izod and Messnager tests.
