Reverting to my letters of the 17th and 27th July last regarding the issue of Irish freeboard certificates to the vessels enumerated, I have to acquaint you no information has yet been received in this Office relative to the alteration of the lettering of the markings to correspond to Irish Law in the cases of the steamers "LADY CARLOW", "LADY CONNAUGHT", "LADY LEINSTER", "LADY MUNSTER", "LUIMNEACH" and "MOYALLA", and I shall be glad to learn what arrangements the Owners propose making in the matter in order that the appropriate certificates may be issued.

I have to add that the last freeboard surveys held on these ships were as follows:-
