Dear Sir,

The Twin Screw "LADY CONNAUGHT" is being fitted out as a Hospital Ship. It has been decided to raise the freeboard deck to the superstructure deck by filling in the forward and aft wells and fitting hinged steel doors in the ships' side in place of the present gangway doors. It will be noted there is a difference in height between the forecastle and bridge tween decks.

I shall be glad to be informed what increase of draft may be allowed and also the scantlings of shell, decks, etc., for the structure filling in the wells.

It is proposed to close the hatchways by plating them over with the exception of the portions to be fitted as steel companionways.

I shall be glad to have a copy of the midship section and profile for reference purposes.
