SOURCE OF INFORMATION

LADY PATRICIA.—Willemstad, Dec. 12.—Motor vessel Lady Patricia, 349 tons, lumber, grounded on Nov. 30 two miles off California Lighthouse, Aruba, heavy leakage. Owner expected at Aruba 15th.

LADY PATRICIA.—Curacao, Dec. 13.—Motor vessel Lady Patricia, 349 tons, lumber, evidently stranded, sea water jettisoned approximately 40,000 board feet of lumber deck cargo and ran ship aground in two feet of water on sand bottom with cargo scattered. Vessel resting easily. The cure "no pay" contract with Lloyd Hull, ex-salvage officer, Merritt's New York. Six-inch, 300 and 200 pumps, installed on Dec. 9, pumped six dry two hours put with small success in floating. Allowed sea to fill, now resting on its side, smooth sea, little swell. Four-inch pump can pump back. "Unable to date charter. Salvage beach gear, expert pull firm, morning (Dec. 10) with beach gear and good chance of floating. Remaining cargo on vessel in good condition. Discharge direct from vessel to cargo agents per Salvage Association (See issue of Dec. 2.)

LADY PATRICIA.—Curacao, Dec. 13.—Motor vessel Lady Patricia: Impossible to recover jettisoned cargo. Estimated amount of lumber on deck in good condition 75,000 board feet. Estimate same amount in hold damaged by seawater. Salvage officer negotiating small vessels at Aruba to remove deckload. Vessel flooded, sea smooth. Will arrange tally with General Average adjuster.—Lloyd's Agents per Salvage Association. (See issue of Dec. 10.)

LADY PATRICIA.—London, Dec. 16.—The following message has been received from the owner of motor vessel Lady Patricia: Lloyd's diver reports wood ends loose and keel badly damaged. This in my opinion is to be considered a total loss. Due to conditions on board request abandoned ship. (See issue of Dec. 15.)

LADY PATRICIA.—Curacao, Dec. 17.—Motor vessel Lady Patricia: Vessel to be considered a total loss, little hope of salvage of cargo.—Lloyd's Agents per Salvage Association. (See issue of Dec. 17.)

LADY PATRICIA.—Curacao, Dec. 20.—Motor vessel Lady Patricia: Examination to-day reveals vessel flooded to sea level and hogged at forward end of deck-house, with bulwark rail scarphs open about one inch. Signs of straining at ends of deck-house. Diver reports stern post and skeg fractured and planking on port side at loosening, also lag screws for outer stern bush loose and several seams of hull and keel badly damaged.—Salvage Association's Surveyor. (See issue of Dec. 20.)

LADY PATRICIA.—Aruba, Dec. 28.—Motor vessel Lady Patricia: No further developments as local salvage efforts ceased on account of inadequate facilities and prohibitive costs when deck cargo was completely discharged on Dec. 21. Salvaged lumber being measured but figures not yet available. Recommend salvaged lumber be sold to avoid further shore charges.—Salvage Association's Surveyor and Lloyd's Agents. (See issue of Dec. 28.)

LADY PATRICIA.—Aruba, Dec. 29.—Motor vessel Lady Patricia: New York advises Merritt's not interested in salvage on basis proposed and have cable asking on what basis they would be interested. Without expert diver and crew, salvage gear and tug, vessel not be refloated and position getting serious. Only alternative will be to leave vessel and cargo "where is as is," all equipment here inadequate.—Salvage Association's Surveyor and Lloyd's Agents. (See issue of Dec. 30.)

LADY PATRICIA.—Curacao, Jan. 4.—Motor vessel Lady Patricia: Owner advises living conditions on board now dangerous and leaving with remainder of crew. He has written to salvor, leaving vessel in his care as from 8 a.m. on Jan. 6.—Salvage Association's Surveyor and Lloyd's Agents. (See issue of Dec. 31.)
