


Memorandum of alterations reported since ship was surveyed for assignment of Load Lines

FREEING PORTS The wood cladding closing the openings at ships side (pys.) between top of bulwark plating and 'B' deck curtain plate has now been removed and freeing port area increased.

AS NOW FITTED. PORT SIDE. Length of bulwarks 310.7 feet. Height 3'-8" above deck.

Freeling ports. 9 @ 2'-9" x 1-7" and 1. @ 1-10" x 1-0"

STARBD. SIDE. Length of bulwarks. 303.7 feet. Height 3'-8" above deck.

Freeling ports 9. @ 2'-9" x 1-7 and 1 @ 1-10" x 1-0"


FREEING PORT. AREA. 41 square feet PYS. plus 5'-0" open rails.

FREEING PORTS filled with hinged steel shutters and one rod 1" dia.

" " SILLS. - 9" ABOVE STEEL DECK.

SIDE SCUTTLES. Side scuttles filled in "E" twin decks. (23 P.S. & 23 SS). 10" dia. 2020

Scuttles of heavy brass construction with hinged brass deadlights and portable steel plugs. Vertical distance of sill to lowest side scuttle above top of keel = 29'-7".



EMPIRE CLYDE.

W.T. BULKHEADS. Openings have been cut in the following bulkheads.

FR. 27. One opening between 'C' and 'D' decks and one between 'D' and 'E' decks.

FR. 81. Two openings (I.P. and I.S.) between 'C' and 'D' decks.

FR 139. One opening between 'C' and 'D' decks, and one between 'D' and 'E' decks.

HATCHWAYS. NO. 4 HATCH ON "C" AND "B" DECKS. Forward end of hatchway on both decks has been plated over and steel companion way fitted on aft ends.
