In reply to your letter of the 13th instant respecting our report No.14345 on freeboards for the trawler "NOTRE DAME DE FRANCE", Messrs. Smith's Dock Co's No.950 vessel, we have to state that the vessel will trim approximately 6 feet by the stern when loaded to the disc.

The centre of flotation of the load water plane is 6 feet 9 inches abaft the middle of length.

There are no sidelights below the upper or raised quarter decks.

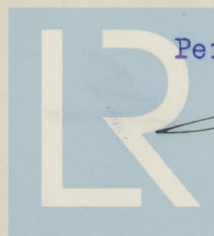
