GRAMSBERGEN. — Portpatrick Radio.
Nov. 27.—Following received from
Dutch motor vessel Gramsbergen
(Silloth for Swansea):

At 2 16 a.m., G.M.T.: Mayday
(urgency signal), position Fishguard
harbour, strike the rock. Position very
dangerous, send lifeboat. Cannot receive
you as my receiver is out of order.

At 2 59 a.m., G.M.T.: Position Fish-
guard harbour near Bishop Rock.
Please send us lifeboat or tug.

Fishguard, Nov. 27.—
Fishguard lifeboat was launched at
3 5 a.m. to the assistance of Dutch
motor vessel Gramsbergen, ashore at
Fishguard harbour.

Portpatrick Radio.
Nov. 27.—Following received from
motor vessel Gramsbergen at 5 18 a.m.,
G.M.T.: We are making water in
engine-room and hold, are drifting away
but lifeboat is coming back. We go in
lifeboat.

Following received from coastguard at
Strumble Head at 8 22 a.m., G.M.T.:
Fishguard lifeboat has all 11 of the crew
of Gramsbergen on board and is now
standing by the vessel.

Fishguard, Nov.
27.—Motor vessel Gramsbergen, of Rot-
terdam, has gone ashore in Fishguard
Bay; all crew landed by lifeboat. Vessel
abandoned and flooded.

Fishguard, Nov. 28.
—Fishguard lifeboat returned to base at
10 25 a.m. yesterday with 11 persons
from Dutch motor vessel Gramsbergen.

GRAMSBERGEN.—Goodwick, Dec. 8.—
A damaged ship's lifeboat, 18 ft. by 6 ft.,
marked "Gramsbergen, Rotterdam,"
and 28 steel-banded wooden hatch
covers, unmarked, were found on the
beach at Pwllgaelod, Dinas Cross, on
Nov. 28. A smashed ship's lifeboat,
18 ft. by 6 ft., marked "Gramsbergen,
Rotterdam," some similar hatch covers,
and a small ship's boat, unmarked, were
found afloat near Pwllgaelod, Dinas
Cross. (See issue of Nov. 30.)

GRAMSBERGEN.—Liverpool, Jan. 3.—
Motor vessel Gramsbergen: Men and
diving equipment were dispatched on
Saturday (Jan. 1) when weather was
quiet, but yesterday heavy swell pre-
vented work and to-day conditions are
bad, with wind north-east, force 6
(strong breeze), and boating impossible.

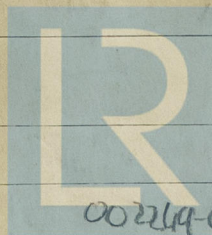
