In accordance with instructions from the Committee I attended at Lisbon and in company with Mr. Sumner we have examined the vessel as far as possible which the vessel was lying afloat. There are certain items which still remains to be done to complete the survey which are now in hand and it is not anticipated that the vessel will be completed ready for sea before about February 1927.
The following parts have now been examined:- Shell plating examined above the light water line and in way of highlights and found in good condition and the work of chipping and painting the shell inside and outside is already partly done. The shell drawings will be found on our first entry report enclosed with this report.
