the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Master survey damage to No. 3 derrick, stated to have been caused by 16th. November 1944 at 8.35 am whilst discharging cargo from No.4 hold at Londonderry. It is further stated that, whilst working the cargo No.4 derrick was centred over No.4 hatchway and No.3 derrick was positioned overside at some 60 to 70 from the centre line.

Upon examination on 16th Nov.1944 found and recommended as follows:-

RECOMMENDED.

No.3.derrick (apparently built in three tube sections) heel section buckled and bent to angle of about 45 at about 5 ft. from the heel. External diameter of tube 7 7/8 inches. Ho running gear broken.

Heel section to be renewed of material available, otherwise derrick to be renewed.

All renewals necessary in order to carry out the above recommendations to be afterwards replaced and made good.
