Dear Sir,

With reference to the Bristol first entry reports Nos. 10423, 10509, 10525, and 10526, on engines built by Messrs. I. J. Abdela & Mitchell Ltd., at Brimscombe, to the order of the Admiralty for steam drifters, the two former of which have been fitted into the drifters "FOAM" and "FOAMBREAK" built at the Queensferry yard of the same firm, I have to remind you that the fee of £9. 0. 0, in each case still remains unpaid, and to request that you will be good enough to take the matter up with the Engine builders and endeavour to obtain an early settlement, in view of the length of time that the accounts have been outstanding.

I may say that the Society's Liverpool Office on the 29th January last wrote stating that the builders desired to be furnished with the machinery certificates for the "FOGBREAK" and "FOAM" as early as possible, and these documents were forwarded to be handed over on payment of the fees for the survey of the engines, and I think it well to enclose for your information a copy of a letter I have to-day addressed to the Society's Liverpool Office in reference to this case.
