Mr. Edwards telephoned from Hull to say that he has visited Grimsby and has made enquiries regarding the recently reported foundering of the above trawler.

Survivors have been landed at Grimsby and Mr. Edwards states that according to the information from them it would appear that the fishing gear was landed heavily on the deck and fractured a scuttle to the bunkers through which water entered the engine room.

Mr. Edwards further states that as a result of enquiries he finds that the trawler had been generally very well maintained.
