In reply to your letter of the 2nd instant respecting the case of the "EMPIRE MAVIS", we have to state that the size of the hatches within the bridge are 3' x 3'-6", and 6' x 6", and it is to the latter that the additional beam has been fitted, the covers previously having an unsupported span of 6 ft.

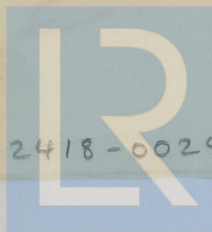
We confirm that the bearing surface of all hatch beams for each of the hatchways on the freeboard deck were found to be 5" on arrival at this port.
