FOR DOCKING Vessel placed in drydock, examined propellers and outside
 fastenings.

FOR CONTINUOUS SURVEY OF ENGINES Opened up:- Port main engine Nos. 3
 and 4 cylinder covers, port and starboard main engine Nos. 8 main bearings
 and pins. Starboard main engine No. 2 cylinder, cover, piston and rod.

FOR DONKEY BOILER SURVEY Scotch donkey boiler examined throughout with
 mountings, safety valves adjusted under steam to 110 lbs./sq.inch,
 O.F. installation examined under working conditions, fire fighting
 appliances and control rods examined.
