

In accordance with the Regulations of the Department of Commerce, the vessel shall be permanently marked by centre punch marks or other marks given in this certificate are to be entered in the log book as, any changes are made in the structural condition of the vessel, this certificate will be cancelled and must be destroyed. A new certificate will be issued for that purpose, and the owners are to be notified of the same.



When navigating a river or inland water deeper loading of fuel, etc., required for the completion of the voyage shall be obtained in accordance with the regulations of the vessel is found to be extended and so entered in the log book. No entry should be made on a certificate unless it has been produced to and endorsed by the Surveyor.
