This certificate remains in force until 6th September 1941

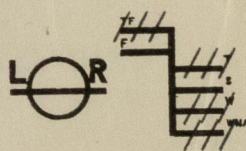

With the Regulations of the Department of Commerce, the permanently marked by centre punch marks or marks given in this certificate are to be entered in the logbook as, any changes are made in the structural condition, this certificate will be cancelled and must be destroyed of Shipping for that purpose, and the owners obtain a new certificate.

When navigating a river or inland water deeper loading of fuel, etc., required for the voyage must be obtained in accordance with the vessel is found to be extended and so entered.

It is to be noted that there is only one valid certificate.

No entry should be made on a certificate which has been produced to and endorsed by the Surveyor.
