The torsional vibration characteristics of the main propelling machinery were approved in Secretary's letter of 21.12.44 for a duplicate vessel, except that in the present case the M.I.P. of the main engine is somewhat less than before. It is considered this will give insignificant changes to the torsional vibration characteristics and that they are acceptable.

This vessel's machinery appears to have been built in accordance with the Rules and the approved plans, and it is submitted she is eligible to be classed
