The closing appliances of all openings in the Freeboard & Raised Quarter Decks, Machinery Casings & Companionways & the access openings in the Forecastle Bulkhead examined & found satisfactory.

This ship, in my opinion, is fit to proceed in tow as a hulk from London to Rotterdam.
