SOURCE OF INFORMATION

CALLISTO. — North Foreland Radio, Feb. 24. — Following received from Scheveningen Radio:

At 11 8 p.m., G.M.T.: SOS, collision between motor vessel Callisto, PDIK, (Pepeel for Ymuiden) and steamer ANDROS STREAM, ELRG, position lat. 51 45 N., long. 2 45 E.

At 11 36 p.m., G.M.T.: British motor vessel Isle of Ely will reach position in half an hour. Two tugs from Holland on way.

London, Feb. 25. — Steamer ANDROS STREAM reported last night that at 10 30 p.m. G.M.T. in lat. 51 43 N., long. 2 36 E., motor vessel Callisto, owing to dense fog, had been in collision with her bow. ANDROS STREAM had damage in her forepeak and was proceeding to Rotterdam for repairs.

North Foreland Radio, Feb. 25. — Following received from steamer ANDROS STREAM at 12

a.m., G.M.T.: Corrected position of collision lat. 51 43 N., long. 2 36 E. Following received from Scheveningen Radio:

At 12 51 a.m., G.M.T.: ANDROS STREAM bound for Rotterdam. Motor vessel Callisto not replying. Motor vessel Isle of Ely near new position.

At 2 43 a.m., G.M.T.: Callisto sunk, crew safely on board German motor vessel Julia, DHQB.

Rotterdam, Feb. 25. — Dutch motor vessel Callisto, Pepeel for Ymuiden with a cargo of ore, collided on Feb. 24 in North Sea, off North Hinder Light-vessel, with Liberian steamer ANDROS STREAM. Callisto sank and crew taken on board German motor vessel Julia. ANDROS STREAM reported damaged and proceeding to Rotterdam.

The Hague, Feb. 25. — The crew of 34 of motor vessel Callisto arrived at the Hook of Holland to-day in the German motor vessel Julia, which rescued them last night after a collision in dense fog with steamer ANDROS STREAM. The crew, all uninjured, spent just under an hour in their lifeboats before being picked up near the spot where the Callisto sank. — Exchange Telegraph Company.

CALLISTO. — Rotterdam, Feb. 26. — Motor vessel Callisto is lying in position lat. 51 41 N., long. 2 37 E., with one mast showing above water. A wreck buoy has been placed in position. — "Nieuwe Rotterdamse Courant." (See issue of Feb. 27.)
