The contents of your report No. 12397 have been noted, and the case has been under consideration today in connection with an appeal by the Owners' London Agents for permission to run the ship until the 7th October.

As the year of grace for the overdue Special Survey will expire at the end of July, the Committee have found considerable difficulty in complying with the Owners' request, but in view of what the Agents have written, the Committee have decided to regard this case as an unusual one, and have agreed to the ship remaining in service until 7th October, provided opportunity is afforded one of the Society's Surveyors to carry out a General Examination of the vessel afloat in the meantime.

You will see from the enclosed copy of letter which has been addressed to the Agents that it is concluded such General Examination will be held at your port, but that if not it will be necessary for you in addition to furnish your concurrence in the Committee's decision, bearing in mind the fact that the vessel has been drydocked at your port already twice this year.

With regard to the note at the end of your report that an Interim Certificate was seen on board recommending assignment of TS.0G 5,57, it is thought well to comment that this notation was not assigned

owing to the shaft requiring to be re-examined by the end of April, 1958, but the Piraeus Surveyor has since stated that in his opinion this period may be extended until October, 1958.
