I have seen the letter of the 12th ultimo addressed
by you to Messrs. Lykiardopulo of London regarding the General
Examination, Freeboard and Boiler Surveys of the above vessel.

The Owners hope to commence the General Examination
towards the end of this month but, as written to you in
my letter of the 17th April, 1945, she is still on special service
and cannot easily be laid off for any lengthy period of time.

I am, therefore, proposing to act similarly as last year
and carry out parts of the General Examination during the periods
of discharging and loading and, in these circumstances, I think
it well to keep her in the records as under survey and when the
survey is complete she will be reported on with all relative
dates of examination of boilers, etc.

A start was made to-day by the examination of the forward
boiler and on return next week the survey will be further
advanced.
