We have received a telegram from our Alexandria agent in connection with the Greek passenger steamers the "IONIA" and "CORINTHIA" which are requisitioned by the Greek Government and are attached to the Greek Fleet in the Eastern Mediterranean as auxiliaries. The agents say that your surveyor in Alexandria has notified that the "IONIA" must pass a general survey and the S.S. "CORINTHIA" a boiler and tail shaft survey.

The Naval authorities require these vessels to be always ready for service, and have asked that the surveys should be postponed for one year. We shall be glad if you will consider this request. and we trust that you will allow the postponement of the surveys.
