Repairs on account of Damage (the cause of which must be stated) should be separated from Repairs due to other causes; and besides being detailed in the body of the report, should be summarised in the form shown below. Whenever the replacement of Anchors or Chains is reported the particulars should be clearly stated in the space provided on the back of this form. REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR stated leakage after vessel had been icebound at Rimouski, P.Q. during the winter months.

On examination of the vessel as she lay afloat at Rimouski, P.Q. in a ballast condition found rivets leaking in forward St. bilge No. 1 hold, St. side shell 2nd plate below sheer abreast forward end No. 4 hatch, and port side deck plates at aft end of No. 2 hatch and forward side of No. 4 hatch pierced in several places. No. 1 hold P & St. bilge sounding pipes fractured. The Owners' Representative requested that the minimum temporary repairs only be effected to allow the vessel to proceed to Montreal, in ballst, for drydocking Special Survey and repairs.

TEMPORARY REPAIRS NOW DONE:- St. side forward No. 1 hold cement box fitted, st. side shell 2nd below sheer hole plugged with wooden plug as also small holes in deck plates at aft end No.2 hatch and forward end of No.4 hatch. Windlass and steering gear both steam and hand gear tried and found satisfactory.

General Observations, Opinion as to Class, Recommendation, &c. :-

State clearly whether any and, if so, what alteration is suggested to be made in the existing classification and notification of the vessel in the Register Book consequent upon this survey, thus, for example: "to remain as classed in the Register Book without fresh record of Survey," "to remain as classed and to have record of survey, 1,38," or "to remain as classed and to have record of survey, 1,38, and the notations of ss No. 1-38."

This vessel is eligible in my opinion to remain as at present classed without fresh record of Survey subject to cement box in forward side No. 1 hold & plugged st. side shell plate and deck plates being dealt with on arrival at Montreal where the vessel is now bound in ballast, and to all other recommendations at present attached to the vessel's class as previously recommended.
