the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Messrs. J. & E. Hall Ltd., attend their Works at Dartford, Kent, on the 16th November, 1951, and subsequently, for the purpose of examining and testing 2 heater coils, 2 heater casings, 1 preheater coil, 1 air vessel, 1 discharge filter and 1 suction filter, made to the order of Messrs. Todd Oil Burners Ltd., London, and intended for Messrs. Naskov Skibsvaerft A/S, (s.s. "P.N. Damm").

The parts were subjected to the following hydraulic pressures in the presence of the undersigned:-

2 Heater Coils	500 lbs. per square inch
2 Heater Casings	500 lbs. per square inch
1 Preheater Coil	500 lbs. per square inch
1 Air Vessel	500 lbs. per square inch
1 Discharge Filter	500 lbs. per square inch
1 Suction Filter	200 lbs. per square inch

All the above withstood the tests applied and were found suitable for a working pressure of 250 lbs. per square inch, with the exception of the suction filter, which is suitable for a working pressure of 100 lbs. per square inch.

Each part has been stamped for identification purposes with the test pressures and with the initials of the undersigned.
