Dear Sir,

S/S "NIKOBAR", "SERAMPORE", and "TRANQUEBAR"

In reply to your letter of the 6th instant we beg to inform you that the question of the classification of these vessels has again been discussed with the Owners, who state that they are not in possession of any certificate or other document stating that the vessels are classed in Lloyd's Register. Considering that the classification is a matter concerned with the insurance of the vessels the Owners are still dependent on the Certificates issued by the A.B., in which Society the vessels are still classed. The vessels' Trading Certificates are also based on the A.B. certificates, and as the Owners do not want to submit the vessels to the surveys and requirements of two Classification Societies simultaneously, and they cannot drop one class until they have acquired the other, the Owners suggest that this ^{Society} should either issue efficient Classification Certificates now or leave the matter of classification until the expiration of the present A.B. certificates.

The Owners are furthermore of the opinion that the requirements of a General Examination are covered by the examination
