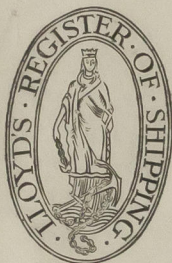

the Owners representative survey the S.S. "JAG JANANI" 6144 tons gross of Bombay on the 12th December 1960 and subsequently whilst the ship was afloat at Calcutta for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of damage stated to have been sustained while at Garden Reach Anchorage, River Hooghly, on the 10th December 1960, when the vessel was required to go astern on the engines while at anchor to avoid M.V. "DINARA" approaching her bows.

Damage confined to steam windlass.

The undersigned upon examination

FOUND

Windlass cast iron bedplate, two aftermost portions, containing the steam cylinder casting seating and the brake anchor bolts, broken off.

Wood sheathing splintered below after part of windlass bedplate.

Starboard crankpin slack.

Steam cylinders and valves.

Two forecastle deck plates slightly set up in way of windlass brakes anchor bolts.

RECOMMENDED

Bedplate to be renewed.

Wood to be renewed.

Crankpin to be renewed.

To be opened for examination.

Two deck plates to be faired in place.


