SOURCE OF INFORMATION

CABO RAZO.—Vigo, Aug. 5.—Spanish steamer Cabo Razo reported sunk in Villagarcia Bay.

Madrid, Aug. 5.—Five people were drowned and eight are missing when the Spanish coastal steamer Cabo Razo sank in the Arosa Estuary to-day. The steamer had a crew of 39 and five women passengers. Fishermen rowed to the vessel when she struck rocks about 540 yards off shore and rescued 31 people. The steamer sank in a few minutes. (Later) Two women, reported missing, were drowned. Their bodies have been recovered.—Reuter.

Madrid, Aug. 5.—Spanish coastal steamer Cabo Razo, bound Malaga with five passengers and 39 crew, burst into flames and sank at the entrance to the harbour of Villagarcia early this morning. The accident occurred in the early hours of the morning, when the vessel was leaving the port. She is believed to have run aground on a shoal, immediately burst into flames and sank rapidly.—British United Press.

CABO RAZO.—Vigo, Aug. 6.—It is confirmed that steamer Cabo Razo sank after striking Pena la Barsa, Arosa Bay. Three female passengers and 10 crew lost. (See issue of Aug. 6.)

CABO RAZO.—Villagarcia, Aug. 5.—Spanish steamer Cabo Razo struck a reef to-day in the Arosa estuary in heavy fog and sank. The vessel was en route to Spanish Mediterranean ports with a cargo of wood and tinned fish.—New York Maritime Association. (See issue of Aug. 7.)
