Dear Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your telegram of to-day's date, as under, viz:-

"Steamer "WILH HEMSOTH" write fully tonight how "case stands"

In regard to this case I beg to state that a letter has been received from Messrs. Sir Raylton Dixon and Co. acting on behalf of the Owners, requesting that the vessel may be surveyed with a view to being classed in the Society's Register.

The survey is now in progress (Examination of framework in Peaks, Holds, Bunkers and Machinery space, and Partial drilling of decks and shell), and it is anticipated that we will be in a position to forward plans to-morrow or Monday shewing the scantlings to which the vessel was built, for the consideration of the Committee.

It is not anticipated that the vessel will be docked within ten days at the earliest.
